NatSIP is...

- a unique national partnership of professionals and voluntary organisations working with children and young people with sensory impairment (SI) and their families
- a partnership of people working together to improve outcomes for children and young people with sensory impairment through promoting collaborative working
- the strategic delivery partner for DfE, now with a contract to March 2018 which will include supporting the sensory impairment workforce, in their response to the Government agenda, to reach the ‘front line’ in education for CYP with SI from 0-25yrs

Sensory Learning Hub

- A first port of call for practitioners working in the sector to find trusted information about sensory impairment
- Primary audience is practitioners working in mainstream settings who are supported by local authority sensory impairment services
- The hub will signpost users to information and resources produced by a range of organisations working with people with sensory impairments, including NatSIP
- Strong emphasis on the role of Sensory Support Services to support mainstream practitioners as well as resources that improve outcomes for children and young people with SI
